



## HLTAID011 Provide First Aid

### OVERVIEW

This unit focuses on the skills and knowledge required to provide a first aid response to a casualty in line with First Aid guidelines determined by the Australian Resuscitation Council (ARC) and other Australian national peak clinical bodies.

These skills will apply to persons who may be required to provide a first aid response in a range of situations, including community and workplace settings.

### WHO SHOULD APPLY FOR THIS UNIT?

HLTAID011 Provide First Aid is a unit for those who are:

- Seeking to gain the skills and knowledge to respond to First Aid requirements in both the community and workplace.
- Currently seeking a role in a workplace that requires mandatory First Aid training.

### CAREER PATHWAY

This First Aid unit is included in many training packages and the resulting statement of attainment can be used as a credit for a variety of qualifications. Students may wish to complete other First Aid courses such as:

- HLTAID014 – Provide Advanced First Aid
- HLTAID010 – Provide Basic Emergency Life Support

### ASSESSMENT METHODS

The following assessment methods are used for the unit of competency, please refer to the Assessment and Delivery Schedule for details of specific task.

- Direct observation – Students will need to undertake CPR in front of the assessor. Observations will be conducted in either the workplace environment, at a work placement, or in the classroom. Some classroom observations will be conducted in a simulated work environment. Sometimes an observation will be of normal workplace duties and sometimes it's of a specific event, like a presentation.
- Product based methods – These are generally scenarios and role plays.
- Questioning – Written questioning is used as one of the assessment methods. This can be done verbally as a reasonable adjustment for students with disabilities impacting their ability to complete written tasks.

### ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

There are no pre-requisites for this course. However, EduNex Training requires that students meet the following criteria:

- Have a suitable level of (English) language, literacy and numeracy skills to complete the course requirements.
- Students must have reasonable fitness to perform the requirements of First Aid, including bending, lifting, kneeling and performing CPR on an adult manikin on the floor.
